





## 2024 Training

Annual requirements for Fire and EMS continuing education takes a considerable amount of time, but necessary to keep our skills honed.



























#### **Around the Station**




#### On the Call

SHAES had a record number of incidents once again in 2024. Even with all the obstacles encountered, our extremely dedicated staff kept our community safe. It takes a special person to get respond at 3AM...and do a good job. We are fortunate to have a roster of thirty Paid on Call, nineteen Career, and six Life Members to pull the load. From being dispatched on duty to the fourth call of the night, to leaving Christmas dinner with the family, the alarms do not take a day off. Our members rarely enjoy a true day off. Even when out of town, the responsibility and desire to serve is still present. I commend all of our members for their dedication, service and will to serve the communities we protect.



2024 was the busiest in SHAES' history with 2,699 alarms. Each year our call volume increases but all of our members contribute, finishing every as a success. 2025 is proving to be another busy year, but I'm confident that with our dedicated staff, support from our Authority Board, and continued backing from our communities, we will submit our next annual report with success stories and pictures to share, as we have the last 28 years.





#### Ten-year call response history











## **2024 Estimated Structure Fire Loss**










#### **SHAES Honor Guard**





#### **South Haven Area Emergency Services**

On January 1, 1996 a joint fire and ambulance service authority was formed under the name of South Haven Area Emergency Services. While authorities were not a new concept, the undertaking of such a project in our area was daunting but the members responsible for incepting SHAES were confident that this was the best way to provide quality fire and medical services in the changing times.

Twenty-nine years later, SHAES operates out of three stations, providing coverage to Casco Township, Geneva Township, South Haven City and South Haven Township. ALS transport ambulance service, fire protection and rescue are only a few services provided. 15,000 year-round residents over the span of nearly 100 sq. miles rely on SHAES' professional services. This commitment was made twenty-nine years ago and is as strong, or stronger, than it was in 1996. SHAES' founding members were absolutely correct in their belief that this organization would blossom into a proud association of men and women willing to do what is necessary to provide only the best to the communities we serve.
